1. President

As of January 1, 2025, <u>Dr. Regis Simo</u> was appointed and approved as the new President of the AfIELN - 2025-2027.

Dr Regis Simo is a Lecturer in International Trade Law at Queen's University Belfast. His research focuses on international law, international economic law, law and development, and African Union (economic) Law. In September 2022, he was appointed a UK Trade and Sustainable Development Domestic Advisory Group (UK TSD DAG) Member Representative by the UK Department for International Trade (DIT). Dr Simo is a South African National Research Foundation C-rated Scholar (as an established researcher) effective 1 January 2023. He serves on the Editorial Board of the German Law Journal, the African Journal of International Economic Law and the International Journal of Public Law and Policy. He is also a Contributing Editor of AfrononomicsLaw, a blog focusing on all aspects of international economic law relating to Africa and the Global South.
